

WHO'S WHO

PETER SHAFFER (Playwright) has written a number of plays for stage and screen, including *The Salt Land*, his first play which was presented on BBC; *Five Finger Exercises* (1958), which won the Evening Standard Drama Award and the Drama Critics Award; *Equus*, which won the 1975 Tony Award for Best Play, as well as the New York Drama Critics Circle Award; and *Amadeus* (1984), which won eight Academy Awards including "Best Picture." Shaffer's cannon includes a unique mix of philosophical dramas and satirical comedies, and continues to expand. His most recent work was the stage play *The Gift of the Gorgon*, which was produced in London in 1992, the same year in which he won the William Inge Award for Distinguished Achievement in the American Theater. Shaffer is from Liverpool, England.

ROB ROSS (Director) is a senior English major with a concentration in Theater from Oakland, CA. Oberlin credits include *Life Under Water* (Director). He was the directing intern at the Pacific Conservatory of the Performing Arts. Ross is directing *Equus* for his Senior Honors Project.

SARAH BENDIX (Scene Designer) is a senior English major with a concentration in theater from Winetka, IL. Oberlin credits include *Lucia Mad* (Set Designer); and *Plath/Mouth* (Puppet Designer/Puppeteer); *Outside Over There (Ensemble)* and *Primitive Streak* (Ensemble/Director).

DANIEL CARMICHAEL (Assistant Stage Manager) is a senior math major from Roebling, NJ. Oberlin credits include *HMS Pinafore* (Boatswain/Assistant Director/Lighting Designer); *Very Truly Yours* (cast); *Yeomen of the Guard* (Director); and *Wizard of Oz* (Co-Stage Manager).

MIRLA CRISTE AGNIR (Choreographer) '85, is a Visiting Assistant Professor of Theater and Dance. She was a Theater major and Dance minor at Oberlin College and received her Master of Fine Arts at the University of California, Irvine. She enjoyed a professional stage career for many years after Oberlin and is a member of Actors Equity Association, AFTRA and the Screen Actors Guild.

CHRIS FLAHARTY (Costume Designer) is a Resident Designer/Associate Professor of Theater for the Oberlin College Theater and Dance Program and the Opera Theater of the Oberlin Conservatory of Music. With professional and educational companies he has designed costumes for original dance and performance pieces, as well as classic and contemporary plays ranging from Shakespeare and Beckett to Moliere and Mamet, with representative works as diverse as Tartuffe (for which he was awarded a USITT design citation), The Gospel at Colonus, On the Verge, Hamlet The Three Sisters, Twelfth Night, Picnic, Zastrozzi, Into the Woods, and Triumph of Love the latter two he also directed at Oberlin College. Mr. Flaharty's designs for opera have featured several pieces from the Mozart repertory and a number of

works from the standard canon, as well as twentieth century music theater works.

JEN GROSETH (Sound Designer) received her BA in 1991 from the University of Wisconsin, Eau Claire in Theater Arts-technical emphasis, and her MFAs in Sound in 1994 and in Lighting in 1995 from the University of Illinois. Her professional credits include Ohio Light Opera Company in Wooster, OH; Stage One Children's Theater in Louisville, KY; and the Illinois Repertory Theater, Champaign-Urbana. Ms. Groseth is certified in sound as "Second Engineer" and teaches Lighting Technology, Lighting Design, and Sound Design.

MICHAEL GRUBE (Managing Director) is the Managing Director of the Theater and Dance Program as well as the Scene Designer for theater and dance events and the Conservatory of Music's Opera Theater. This is his 20th year with Oberlin College. An MFA graduate of Carnegie-Mellon University, his professional credits include work with The Opera Company of Boston; Music Theatre North; GeVa Theatre; and Stage One in Louisville, Kentucky. Mr. Grube's summer credits include designs for Music Theatre of Wichita, in Wichita, Kansas; the College Light Opera Company in Falmouth, Massachusetts; and the Ohio Light Opera in Wooster, Ohio. He is the Chair of the Zoning Board of Appeals for the City of Oberlin.

RICK MAYFIELD (Technical Director) received his BS in Theater in 1985 from Northern Michigan University, and in 1996 his MFA in Theater Technology from the University of Tennessee in Knoxville. His professional credits include work with Piper Productions and Nickelodeon Studios, Orlando, FL; Ohio Light Opera Wooster, OH; Actors Theater of Louisville, KY; and Alabama Shakespeare Company. Mr. Mayfield teaches the Technical Production classes and supervises the Theater-199 run crew requirements.

MEG MORLEY (Stage Manager) is a sophomore Theater Production/ Design major from Sante Fe, NM. Oberlin credits include Media Medea (Stage Manager); Love's Labour's Lost (Master Electrician); House of Yes (Stage Manager); and Quills (Assistant Stage Manager/Props Mistress). PROGRAM NOTES

In early 1972, Peter Shaffer and a friend were driving through the English countryside. As they passed a horse stable, his friend remembered an unconfirmed story he had heard, not long before, of a crime involving a young man and twenty six horses. Though the story was relayed in casual conversation, it was a tale so graphic, so horrific, yet so terrifyingly compelling, it prompted Peter Shaffer to compose one of the grandest and most theatrically stunning plays ever written.

To offer you too much information about *Equus* would, in my opinion, diminish its impact. After all, beneath its many thought-provoking investigations of individuality, passion, worship, and psychological confounds, *Equus* is, at its core, a spectacular mystery. Within the first few minutes of its opening, the details of Alan Strang's shocking crime are displayed for all to hear. Though the Who, What, Where, and even When of his transgressions are quickly revealed, the pursuit of exactly *Why* Alan Strang did what he did survives the duration of the play. Unfortunately, solving the mystery is a task that propels Martin Dysart to uncover more questions than answers; questions that may endlessly haunt him and you.
